### 2021 Annual Report

Welcome to the 2021 TLC Learning Center Annual Report! I am excited to share the news of TLC Learning Center and how fortunate I feel to be part of such a great organization that is so loved and supported.

2021 was an amazing year for TLC Learning Center. Perhaps the most notable events were our 7th Annual Kentucky Derby party hosted at The Fox Hill Club, and 40th annual Christmas Tree Festival held at the Longmont Museum. Both were huge successes and reminders of the supportive community we have had in the Longmont area for so many years.

The year 2021 was also a milestone year for TLC Learning Center as we maintained high-quality, dedicated, staff. Over 65% of our staff have been at TLC for at least five years and some have been here 20+, even 30+ years!

Financially, TLC continued to exceed goals for 2021. Both our education and therapeutic services revenue exceeded our expenses, which has been a large focus for us in recent years. Even during the pandemic, we've been able to weather the financial and operating storms with the support of many community individuals, foundations, and government funding programs. For the fifth consecutive year, we closed out the fiscal year with a healthy and positive bottom line! This is in large part due to our education and therapeutic services efficiency, our two special events, and to our dedicated supporters who contributed to TLC.

An especially monumental moment in 2021 was that the Stewart Family Foundation donated \$1 million to TLC! This generous contribution allowed us to increase scholarships for children, make-up operational shortfalls, and earmark \$500,000 for the future expansion of TLC Learning Center. At the end of the year, the Stewart Family Foundation also gave us \$120,000 to go directly to staff salary increases in January of 2022, which was much deserved and very much appreciated!

2021 was also a year of renovation and maintenance on our building. We replaced a large water heater, had a new roof installed, and completed a \$135,000 ADA playground that was completely funded with grants and contributions from generous donors. We are nearly maxed to capacity in our current location with nine total classrooms and a handful of therapy rooms. We currently have waitlists for every classroom, and are experiencing particularly long waitlists for children with special needs. To say we've outgrown our current space after 17 years is an understatement.

Our fundraising events, full classrooms, and therapy caseloads are major accomplishments, especially considering the struggles of the recent pandemic and ongoing workforce shortage. Regardless of the challenges we have faced, we continue our mission, which is to provide, in a fiscally responsible manner, comprehensive early childhood education and therapeutic services to assist each child in reaching his or her highest potential. This is our biggest accomplishment as we aim to ensure each child has what they need to be successful in life!

We continue to look for opportunities to expand our services for more children, expand programs, continue to diversify our funding sources. We want to maintain this level of success for the next 65 years and with your support, we know this is possible. Our door is always open for a tour of the facilities and we are eager to share the message of TLC to civic groups, youth organizations, and other community partners. We hope to see you soon!



# Therapeutic Services Highlights






