TINY TIM HONORS LILA JEAN STEWART WITH THE FIRST EVER LEGACY AWARD



On the evening of March 1, at The Tiny Tim Center's annual dinner and auction, Lila Jean Stewart was awarded the first ever Legacy Award for her ongoing, enthusiastic support for the mission of Tiny Tim. The Legacy Award recognizes

individuals or groups whose support to Tiny Tim is so significant it allows the Center to make great strides in accomplishing its primary goal: to assist each child in reaching his or her highest potential.

Lila Jean has supported the Tiny Tim Center in numerous ways. "I have been involved with Tiny Tim almost from the very beginning," she explained. "As a member of the Soroptimist Club I worked on luncheons, style shows, and the Tree Festivals to raise money. Bill and I have always felt this was the project for us. We are dedicated to Tiny Tim because of the difference that we can make in the lives of children with special needs."

The Stewart's support helped the Center successfully complete a \$2.8 million capital campaign which allowed Tiny Tim to move from a 3,800 square foot facility to our present 15,000 square foot center. After Tiny Tim moved into the new facility, Lila Jean continued her financial support, helping the Center to establish a capital reserve fund for the new building and also assisting in maintaining a balanced budget.

varied reasons for coming to Tiny Tim, but there are some themes I discovered that are true for the eight I spoke with and may be true for you as well. These include:

- Offers children a chance to be children
- Show children through example and play that differences don't mean you can't be friends
- The staff (I heard this over and over) are caring, patient, knowledgeable, dedicated.
- Expert professional staff (therapists) who are always on
- site and can help immediately when problems arise
- Environment is all about the kids.
- Small class sizes with a very low student to teacher ratio* The
 curriculum sensory tables, music with Teedee, movement with
 Mia, exploring complex ideas and concepts in a way children can
 understand, the stories of the week and how they are connected to
 the crafts and the curriculum.
- Integrated class rooms with typical and nontypical children
- Support in identifying differences and assistance in the development of IEP for the child
- Cost is very reasonable, especially considering the individualized attention each child receives

The Board continues to focus on strategic planning. All areas of Tiny Tim are being explored to determine how we can support and enhance our efforts. Our goal is to ensure maximum effectiveness through the wise use of our resources. With the projected 2009 retirement of Executive Director, Teedee Keister, we are acutely aware of the need to provide a seamless succession plan and excited about building on the foundation she has so ably laid. Our donors are another priority area. Without the generous support of individuals and businesses, the magic that occurs at Tiny Tim would be lost. Their donation of time and financial resources make the difference between what we are and what we aspire to be. We cannot and do not take their support lightly. In the fall of 1999, our family was introduced to Tiny Tim because of developmental issues Cooper was experiencing. He was loosing words he had learned, not looking at us anymore, and was quickly slipping away from our family. We were told to make an appointment at this place called Tiny Tim

and I can still remember my first visit. I was feeling so out of control and scared for my son, but my instinct told me I was where he needed to be and boy were my instincts right! Because of Tiny Tim and its exceptional staff, I can truly say that Cooper's life has been saved.

Cooper was diagnosed with autism that fall and our lives have been a whirlwind ever since. This amazing school was our anchor in a time of turbulence and uncertainty. I grew to rely on the expertise and guidance of the truly amazing people who dedicate there lives to working there. I would take Cooper to school and trust with all my heart that these people knew what they were doing and could help our family. Not only did they help Cooper make tremendous progress in speech, motor, and social skills, but they helped Jeff and I learn to trust that the future for Cooper
